Introduction

- NHRC has the mandate to promote and protect human rights in Nigeria.
- NHRC has the powers to monitor, investigate and report human rights violations in Nigeria.
- Since January 2024, NHRC in partnership with UNDP, OHCHR and GANHRI has produced monthly dashboard on human rights situation.
- The Dashboards contain data from complaints lodged at the NHRC 38 offices across Nigeria and human rights violations monitored through NHRC Human Rights Observatory.


General Human Rights Situation

- Human rights complaints to the NHRC increased marginally in the month of March.
- Increased violence and killings in the middle belt.
- Physical and Sexual Violence on Children
- Extra-judicial killings by the Police and the Armed Forces
- The resurgence of Boko Haram related attacks in Borno State
- Increase in the killings of Military, Law enforcement and security agencies.


NHRC March 2025 Human Rights Complaints

 - An increase of 20% compared to March 2025


Human Rights Complaints January - April 2025 Compared




April 2025 Complaints Across Geo-Political Zones




Percentage Distribution of Complaints Across Geo-Political Zones




April 2025 Thematic Human Rights Complaints




April 2025 Violation of Womens' Rights








• Killings and Kidnapping increased by 160% and 240% respectively from March 2025


April 2025 NHRC Human Rights Assessment Dashboard

Killings Across States Compared






Killings and Kidnapping January-December 2024

Violence Against Children

Lagos

- Father beats his daughter to death, buries her in shallow grave
- 16-year-old boy killed by a stray bullet during a cult clash which erupted after an anti-cultism walk
- A couple was arrested for repeated physical abuse on their son for over 18 months.
- Nasarawa 4-years-old orphan brutalised by his uncle for dancing at a naming ceremony
- FCT
 - Abandoned newborn baby found by vigilantes
 - Abandoned newborn Baby found dead by security in Games Village
- Kogi Abandoned baby found by community leader near Niger river in Kogi state
- Borno ISWAP kill 6 children in Kala- Barge

Violence Against Children

Sexual Violence

- Lagos: 39-year-old man defiled his two daughters aged 12 and 14 in Surulere.
- Lagos: 48 old man defiled his daughter aged 16 in Amukoko.
- Ondo Pastor reportedly impregnates 13-year-old disabled girl.
- Bauchi 40-year-old woman arrested for raping a 12-year-old boy in Azare

Impact of Violence on Human Rights


Right to Freedom of Movement

- Gunmen attack and kidnap 19 passengers along Adoka-Naka-Makurdi road
- Gunmen abducted 14 commuters travelling in two vehicles in Eleyin Village in Kwara
- Roadside bomb killed 7 passengers in Borno

Right to Food

- 4 farmers killed in Akure North
- 2 female farmers killed in Delta
- 14 farmers killed in Borno State














April 2025 Complaints Across Geo-Political Zones




April 2025 Thematic Human Rights Complaints
