#### Introduction


- NHRC has the mandate to promote and protect human rights in Nigeria.
- NHRC has the powers to monitor, investigate and report human rights violations in Nigeria.
- Since January 2024, NHRC in partnership with UNDP, OHCHR and GANHRI has produced monthly dashboard on human rights situation.
- The Dashboards contain data from complaints lodged at the NHRC 38 offices across Nigeria and human rights violations monitored through NHRC Human Rights Observatory.

## General Human Rights Situation


- Human rights complaints to the NHRC increased marginally in the month of May.
- Increased violence and killings in the middle belt.
- Deaths relating to flooding
- Killings arising from banditry and conflicts in the north central.
- Physical and Sexual Violence on Children
- The resurgence of Boko Haram related attacks in Borno State
- Increase in the killings of Military, Law enforcement and security agencies.

## NHRC May 2025 Human Rights Complaints


 Total Number of Complaints: 275,256
 [An increase of 5% compared to April 2025]




#### **May 2025 Complaints Across Geo-Political Zones**




## Percentage Distribution of Complaints Across Geo-Political Zones – May 2025




#### **May 2025 Thematic Human Rights Complaints**















Top 5 States in Complaints Resolution
- May 2025




#### Killings, Deaths and Kidnappings in May 2025




#### Killings and Kidnappings April 2025




#### **Top 10 States in Killings in May 2025**

## Violence Against Children

#### Gombe

- 2 year old defiled by step father
- 35 year old defiled a 6 year old

#### Rivers

- Abduction of 10 school children in Degema
- Defilement of 10 year old by a Pastor in Ahoada East
- Abia 14 year old girl attacked by machete after failed rape attempt
- Ekiti 2 minors aged 7 and 9 defiled by 55 year old.
- Zamfara A pregnant woman was abducted by bandits and gave birth to twins while in captivity. The bandits fed the newborns to dogs.

## Violence Against Children

#### Sexual Violence

- Lagos: 39-year-old man defiled his two daughters aged 12 and 14 in Surulere.
- Lagos: 48 old man defiled his daughter aged 16 in Amukoko.
- Ondo Pastor reportedly impregnates 13-year-old disabled girl.
- Bauchi 40-year-old woman arrested for raping a 12-year-old boy in Azare

## Attacks on Community Security

#### **Attacks on Vigilantes**

- Katsina 5 operatives of Community Watch Corps
   (CWC) in Matazu killed in a deadly ambush by bandits
- Kogi 3 young hunters and vigilantes, killed unidentified gunmen in Yagba West
- Sokoto 11 vigilante members from Magonho village, Tanganza killed in gun battle with armed bandits attempting to raid the village

#### **Attacks on Law Enforcement**

- Gombe Kalare group in Yamaltu Deba beat DPO in Gombe, leaving him with severe injuries, including a deep wound on his forehead.
- Kano DPO of Rano Divisional Police Station set ablaze by irate youths

## Attacks on Freedom of Religion

Ondo - Gunmen abducted 3 members of Deeper Life Bible Church

Zamfara - Bandits kill Islamic scholar despite ransom payment

Borno - 2 Christian education officials of the Damboa LEA were killed by an exploded IED planted by ISWAP

Plateau - COCIN Reverend killed by gunmen

Plateau - Gunmen killed Pastor and also injured his wife in Bokkos


Benue - Rev. Fr. was shot by suspected herdsmen in Gwer LGA.

Flooding and Human Rights

Flooding and displacements violate a cocktail of human rights (housing, dignity, movement, association, life, food, health)

Government and stakeholders should adopt human rights-based approaches in their responses.
